ADVOCATING WITH ONE VOICE

We continue to work hard to advocate for Iowa's Community College students and communities at the state and federal levels. See our Annual Legislative Report for a more complete summary of the session. Here's an overview of how we did on our priorities:

Invest in student success

- State General Aid was increased by \$7.2 million. While this was less than we requested or need, it was a higher percentage increase than any other part of lowa's education system.
- Additionally, we were able to gain more flexibility in how we can leverage the GAP Tuition Assistance program to support students.

Address the state's workforce needs

• Worked to ensure that changes made in the government reorganization will positively impact workforce programs and improve outcomes.

Ensure efficiency and effectiveness

- Gained flexibility for property tax levies.
- Eliminated restrictive K-12 policies to allow for more partnerships.
